


From the Pastor's Desk

May...to June...to July the calendar moves on...and so does the pandemic. But finally, there seems to be real hope that we are close to the end. Yes, we are still worshiping differently, and elsewhere around the community restrictions are still in place. Still, there is – finally – light at the end of the tunnel! That is, of course, good news. For all of us, in so many ways. All the disruptions of life over the past year are beginning to fade away. A return to normal is on the horizon. But not everything will return to normal, and really, I hope not. Some things need to stay changed. Like an appreciation for time with family, and the discovery of new ways to do old things, and learning to persevere, even in tough, uncertain times. We need to keep all that. But what about church...and faithful disciples...and followers of Jesus...what about us? What do we need to keep? We need to keep...the Church! Of course, I want to keep the church, you know, St. Paul. I'm looking forward to the day when this is really all over, and we can worship with a full house, gather together in Sunday School and Confirmation, and enjoy time together over cups of coffee. I'm hopeful we can again have a Neighborhood Corn Roast, music from the choir, and the energy of children pulsating throughout the building. All that makes "church," church! But that's not what I said. I want to keep "the Church." Church, with a capital "C." Yes, I love St. Paul, and I love the work we do together. We make a difference, we change lives, we proclaim hope in times of fear and uncertainty. We preach Christ crucified! The work of the church, the work we do as a community of the faithful. The work of the "church." But what, then, is the work of the "Church" (capital "C")? Well, a lot of it is the same. The "Church" isn't about St. Paul, or the ELCA, or any other congregation. It's about the "Church" the Body of Christ – God's people at work. And a lot of that work happens together – you know, you, me, and everyone else, together, in the partnership of a faith community – like St. Paul. But when the "Church" is at work, it's about much more than what happens in the ebb and flow of congregational life. It's about what the Body of Christ is up to – here, there, and everywhere. It's about what we do every day, because in the end, the "Church" is present wherever you happen to be - right now. That is to say, the Church isn't confined to a building (like 3790 W. Water St.), but rather the Church is out and about, active and

moving in our world, present wherever we happen to be, at any time, any place. And that is what the pandemic lifted up to us. For over a year the church building has been closed, locked up. A few ministries went on (like the community garden). Most, however, were on hiatus, shut down until...who knows? But the ministry of the "Church" couldn't be confined by locked doors because the "Church" was already out and about, in the world, active and making a difference. How so? In YOU in your daily life, in the many ways in which you connected with those around you, making a difference in a world that was filled with so many unknowns, so many fears, and so many uncertainties. As YOU lived a life of faithful discipleship, in your corner of the world, wherever you happened to be, the "Church" was hard at work. That has always been the case. We have always been the "Church" out in the world. But the pandemic gave us the opportunity to realize and discover that God is still at work through the "Church," even when the "church" is restricted with locked buildings and curtailed programs. So as our world begins to return to normal, I hope – even pray – that we don't lose that discovery, that in our everyday lives, in our corners of the world, we are in fact the "Church" - hard at work, doing God's work with our hands. Imagine what realizing that we are making a difference, each of us in our own way, as the "Church" might mean to us as we gather as the "church." Each of us knowing that the other, like our self, goes out each day to be the "Church," to be God's presence in a disturbed and disrupted world. That's worth keeping! And perhaps one of the gifts of the pandemic that we can hang on to will be the opportunity to embrace this new discovery with joy, wonder, and amazement – as we see God's Holy Spirit at work in what we do, and in the "new" that we have experienced! So, as the pandemic begins to wane, look forward to coming back to church, to our worship, our gatherings, our ministries. But don't lose the Church. Keep living as faithful disciples day in and day out, wherever you are. Keep being what Covid could not prevent – keep being...the Church!


