

My Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We were privileged to have members from the congregation to attend our Council Meeting on May 13. Individuals spoke and shared concerns about: roof leakage, electronic sign, carpet/chairs cleaning, and lawn maintenance. All of these were addressed by the Council as follows:



- •Roof Leakage: The Council voted to retain Zimmer Roofing to remove and replace the rubber membrane and wet insulation, starting at the scupper box, located within the front cross and flower bed area, south about 25 ft. This work should begin soon.
- •Electronic Sign: The Council authorized the president to appoint a committee to continue research on sign specifications, possible sources, and cost. Jan Thomas has been appointed chair and is currently organizing this committee's work. We hope to entertain a proposal at the June Council Meeting.
- •Carpet/Chair Cleaning: Jacques Merkau is securing cost information and will procure this work as had been planned.
- •Lawn Maintenance: A contract had already been signed with D&B Lawn Service to cut the church lawn once every other week. People have different opinions about whether it should be more frequent than that. For now, there is only enough money in the budget for every other week. However, the Council will review this at the next meeting.

There were also concerns by some members about the amount of funds available for future projects requiring capital outlay. As we begin working on next year's budget, I and the Finance Committee will discuss some alternative options that could make more funds available while maintaining fiscal integrity.

I want to thank the people who came to our last Council Meeting. You are always welcomed. I would also like to thank our council members who continue to volunteer their time and efforts in so many ways to further St. Paul's mission.




Food Truck Report 5/16/24

A huge thank you to the 28 great volunteers who helped with this food truck. We had 166 families come to get food for 528 individuals. We received 10,768 pounds of food and had about 6 boxes left over. The leftover food went to Harbor Impact for distribution to more needy families. We used a Thrivent action team grant of \$250.00 toward the cost of this food truck.

CHURCH ENVELOPES

It has been the practice of St. Paul to mail offering envelopes to households wishing to use envelopes to donate to fund the ministry and expenses of the church.

Recently, Augsburg informed us of options that would decrease the cost.


- You can continue to receive a packet of envelopes for each Sunday and special worship opportunities mailed monthly--OR—the cost can be reduced by mailing envelopes in a two-month packet.
- Also, per a request from those who give monthly, it has been noted that the same two-month mailing could included just one envelope per month, plus the special envelopes. This also would reduce the cost and eliminate discarding unused envelopes.

The council is considering these options and would like feedback from the congregation. If you wish to adjust the mailing to the one monthly envelope option, please indicate your request on the sign-up sheet in the narthex or call the office by the end of June.

Once the council has your input, a decision will be made as to how many receive the weekly offering envelopes and how many will be adjusted to a monthly envelope.

Report on Southeast Michigan Synod Assembly May 11, 2024

Nearly 200 delegates and observers attended this year's Southeast Michigan Synod Assembly at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, Ida.

St. Paul was represented by delegates Jim and Linda Ketchum, as well as voting clergy Pastor Branden Hunt, Rev. Bill and Sally Moldwin, and Rev. Ann Preimesberger.

Beyond a list of housekeeping chores involving approval of committee and executive reports and changes to the synod constitution, the assembly heard a report from Bishop Donald Kreiss on his three-month sabbatical last year and approved operating budgets for the synod for 2026 and the Fund for Missions.

Delegates also had the chance to attend one of five workshops prior to the afternoon session. Jim attended a workshop "Inspiring Generosity in Anxious Times" led by Rev. Paul Walters, pastor of Lutheran Church of the Master in Troy and a consultant with GSB Fundraising Consultants. Pastor Walters said, among other things, that before a church begins a fundraising campaign, leaders need to ask: What are the biggest challenges to reaching the goal, what fears will potential givers have and what is the opportunity that giving will bring. One of the biggest challenges is getting congregations excited about a project and help them buy into the idea that the project will help the church in the long run.

Linda attended a workshop on refugees and asylum seekers and what we, as Christians, can do to help. The workshop was led by the synod Immigration and Refugee Task Force. The synod currently is housing a refugee family in a church, and more calls are coming asking for help. Synod leaders say they need to develop a sustainable plan going forward to meet the needs of a growing number of refugees.

Pastor Branden and Don Strauss led a workshop on growing a community garden, how to start one, and how to keep it producing. The garden is something every St. Paul member should be proud of and appreciate.

The assembly concluded with a closing Eucharist and the installation of C. J. Clark as Director for Evangelical Mission.






Property's Work Day




Kroger Community Rewards Program
